Friends of Lions Head ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - 11 April

"Topics affecting the city, bordering on Lion's Head, including The Glen and beaches.

Specifically about any plans to build on the park perimeter, and security issues on Lion's Head, between the council and the TMNP".

Vegetation on Signal Hill

There has been much change in the vegetation on Signal Hill and Lion's Head over the years as the area has been exploited for grazing and fuel since prehistoric times. Jan Van Riebeek found "between the mountain and the downs the most beautiful land for sowing and grazing cattle". Proteaceae and other indigenous species were profuse.

Much has been due to the introduction of alien species of plants and trees and repeated fires have decimated the mountainsides. Flora differed dependent on the fact that Signal Hill forms a barrier against prevailing winds – when the southeaster blows the north western aspect is protected and likewise, when the northwester blows the southern aspect is protected. This helps to account for the different vegetation found on the mountain. By and large however, the vegetation comprises West Coast Renosterveld flora which is distinctive because it is close to the sea and influenced by coastal fog.

Change has been due to several factors. By the beginning of the 20th century most of the flora has been destroyed by agricultural development, fire and by the introduction of alien species mostly pines, eucalyptus varieties and hakea. Over the years large plantations were developed for wood as fuel and to provide shelter from the prevailing winds. The first plantation was established in 1894 consisting mostly of pines in the area of the present Appleton Camp and several others followed. However they were extremely liable to repeated bush fires and so firebreaks and access roads were built to combat this. The first was a road from Kloof Nek to Lion's Head - the present Signal Hill Road, and later the present Jeep track gave access to affected areas. It is not generally known that there was quite a large dam constructed in the Appleton Camp to provide water for fires.

It is only in the last hundred years that attention has been given to the eradication of alien species and reforestation. Indigenous vegetation was reintroduced and silver tree and other proteaceae seed was repeatedly sown. Due to the different conditions the latter only took root on the Camps Bay side of Lion's Head.

A comprehensive scientific survey of flora and fauna on Signal Hill was done by Chrisna Joubert in 1991 from which the above information was obtained and the Friends of Lions Head have been urging for a follow-up to be done in order to establish further changes. The material in this Newsletter has been obtained from this most valuable survey.
